Chapel Arches Bridge, Chapel Arches High Street Maidenhead SL6 1Q	This blue plaque was erected to commemorate the origin of civic life in Maidenhead. The Chapel was founded in 1269 and the earliest-known grant of 'pontage' for repairing Maydenhith (Maidenhead) Bridge was made in 1297. In 1451 a Guild was established in the Chapel to collect money and use it for the maintenance of "the bridge of Maydenhith over the Thames". This was thought to mark the establishment of civic life in the town.	Windsor and Maidenhead Council blue plaque	30 July 1996	
Kidwells Park Marlow Road Maidenhead Berkshire SL6 7DX	J.D.M Pearce is commemorated as the 5 times Mayor of Maidenhead between 1850-1890, and a local benefactor. In July 1890 he presented Kidwells park as a deed of gift to the town.	Windsor and Maidenhead Council blue plaque	6 March 1997	

<p>York Road, Maidenhead United Football Club</p>	<p>Acknowledged by the FA and FIFA to be the oldest senior football ground in the world to be continuously used by the same club. Maidenhead FC played their first game on this ground on 16th February 1871, and have played there ever since. Maidenhead FC also hold the distinction of being one of the original 15 clubs to take part in the first ever FA Cup competition, the oldest football competition in the world.</p>	<p>Windsor and Maidenhead Council blue plaque</p>	<p>13 October 2012</p>
