This section enumerates the various sites around the town which have already been given recognition in the form of a commemorative plaque.

Chapel Arches Bridge, Chapel Arches, High Street, Maidenhead SL6 1QJ	This blue plaque was erected to commemorate a Chapel founded in 1269 that stood close to the bridge of 'Maydenhith.'	Royal Borough of Windsor & Maidenhead blue plaque Unveiled 30 July 1996	
Kidwells Park Marlow Road, Maidenhead SL6 7DX	J.D.M. Pearce is commemorated as the 5 times Mayor of Maidenhead between 1850-1890 and local benefactor. In July 1890 he presented Kidwells park as a deed of gift to the town.	Royal Borough of Windsor & Maidenhead blue plaque Unveiled 6 March 1997	
Maidenhead United Football Club, York Road, Maidenhead SL6 1SF	Acknowledged by FA and FIFA as the oldest senior football ground in the world to be continuously used by the same club. Maidenhead FC played their first game in 1871. They took part in the first FA Cup, the oldest football competition in the world.	Royal Borough of Windsor & Maidenhead blue plaque Unveiled 13 October 2012

<p>Plaque on the wall of the National Westminster Bank, 66 - 68 High Street, Maidenhead, SL6 1QA</p>	<p>Commemorating the site where Charles I met his children in July 1647. He was beheaded in January 1649.</p>	<p>Maidenhead & District Civic Society plaque Unveiling date not known</p>	
<p>Plaque located at the junction of Oldfield Road with Chantry Road, Maidenhead, SL6 1TS</p>	<p>Plaque commemorating one of the boundary stones marking the Fishery Estate</p>	<p>Maidenhead Civic Society Unveiled 2015</p>	
<p>Two plaques located at the entrances to Guards Club Park, Maidenhead, SL6 8DN</p>	<p>Commemorating the site of the Brigade of Guards Boat Club established in 1865</p>	<p>Maidenhead Civic Society Unveiled 1989</p>
